We envision a Pakistan with 'zero out-of-school children' by 2047, where every child has access to education.
















Nurturing Educational Growth

In our commitment to transforming education, TAKMIL Canada has developed the Hybrid Accelerated Model, an innovative approach designed to foster accelerated literacy through personalized learning assessments.

This model integrates three types of assessments to shape each student's educational journey. The process begins with Pre-Assessments, conducted prior to the program's start to identify each learner's literacy level. This insight allows educators to tailor strategies that drive impactful learning from day one.



Journey of a Child with TAKMIL






SCHOOL IN A BOX MODEL

PRACTICAL SOLUTION FOR REMOTE AREA EDUCATION

In the heart of socio-economically marginalized communities, where the absence of proper educational infrastructure casts shadows on the futures of countless children, TAKMIL introduces the groundbreaking concept of "School in a Box." This innovative solution emerges as a beacon of hope for children aged 5 to 15 years, residing in areas deprived of essential educational resources.

The core philosophy of School in a Box revolves around the belief that every child, regardless of their circumstances, deserves access to quality education. School in a Box is not merely a physical entity; it symbolizes a holistic solution tailored to address the unique needs of communities facing resource limitations. The model integrates accelerated learning methodologies, cutting-edge educational technology, digital learning tools, and robust assessments. What sets it apart is the incorporation of Artificial Intelligence and Big Data, ensuring a personalized learning experience for each child.

Acknowledging the realities of children engaged in labor or household responsibilities, the School in a Box model allows for time flexibility. Children can engage in learning for 3-4 hours daily, either in the morning or evening, aligning with their convenience and circumventing barriers that might otherwise hinder their educational journey. This initiative encapsulates TAKMIL's commitment to creating a world where every child, irrespective of their circumstances, can unlock the doors to knowledge and shape a brighter future.





SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

WEEKLY LESSONS

Our program engages children in a weekly journey that goes beyond conventional education, employing dynamic methodologies to cultivate knowledge and vital life skills. Through hands-on projects, practical scenarios, and collaborative group activities, we empower children to develop a diverse skill set essential for success in various life domains.



At its core, the program aims to positively shape children's character, enabling them to make informed life choices and instilling responsible citizenship. Emphasis is placed on managing emotional well-being, fostering soft skills like effective communication, self-presentation, and teamwork—attributes often overlooked in traditional education settings.

Going beyond academic achievement, our program integrates character-building, moral values, and ethics into the learning experience. We actively challenge societal norms that perpetuate regressive attitudes related to gender or socioeconomic factors, fostering an inclusive and empowering environment.

Participants not only gain academic proficiency but also emerge with a keen awareness of their personal agency. This awareness empowers them to break free from limiting stereotypes, contributing to positive change and a more equitable society.

MoU Signing with KAWISH Welfare Trust

On November 29, 2025, TAKMIL Foundation formalized a strategic partnership with Kawish Welfare Foundation through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding at Kawish's Head Office in Lahore.

This collaboration reflects a shared commitment to strengthening education systems, expanding access to quality learning, and addressing educational gaps in underserved communities across Pakistan.

Guided by TAKMIL Pakistan's leadership, the partnership marks an important step toward sustainable, long-term impact—supporting teachers, empowering communities, and creating brighter futures for children nationwide.



MoU Signing with REHMAT Educational Foundation

TAKMIL Foundation has entered into a strategic partnership with Rehmat Educational Foundation (UK) through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding, marking a significant step toward expanding equitable access to education in Pakistan.

The collaboration will focus on sharing Accelerated Learning Program (ALP) and digital learning resources, supporting teacher training and capacity-building initiatives, and strengthening educational opportunities for disadvantaged and working children in underserved communities.

This partnership reflects a shared commitment to innovation, inclusion, and sustainable impact, reinforcing the vision of empowering every child with the right to learn and the opportunity to thrive.



HEALTH AWARENESS SESSIONS

COMMON AND DANGEROUS DISEASES

On 22 April 2025, TAKMIL Foundation successfully conducted a health awareness session focused on common and preventable diseases in Pakistan, including Malaria, Typhoid, and Dengue. The session aimed to educate students on early symptoms, prevention methods, and the importance of hygiene and timely medical care.

This initiative was implemented across two TAKMIL schools in different regions:

- Shaheed Osama Zafar TAKMIL School, Khanewal (Punjab)
- Rashida Abdullah Memorial TAKMIL School, Zagadhery (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa)



On 22nd May 2025, TAKMIL organized an important health awareness session for students in Sindh, focusing on the prevention and early recognition of common yet potentially serious diseases such as measles and chickenpox. The session was facilitated by Dr. Halima Naeem, whose engaging and informative approach helped students grasp essential health knowledge and encouraged them to adopt preventive practices.

From Khushab to Pakistan's Biggest Science Platform: Laiba Malik's Journey

Growing up in Khushab, where educational opportunities were limited, Laiba joined TAKMIL at a time when quality learning seemed beyond reach. Through TAKMIL's supportive learning environment, she discovered not only her academic potential but also her voice and self-belief.

In 2025, Laiba reached a significant milestone by representing TAKMIL at the Lahore Science Mela—Pakistan's largest science exhibition. For the first time, she presented a science project titled "Quantum: Defining the Future of Metal Detection." Standing among students from across the country, Laiba showcased her ideas with confidence, curiosity, and pride. Participating in the Science Mela strengthened her belief in herself and expanded her vision of what education can make possible. Laiba's story reflects the transformative impact of opportunity, mentorship, and community support.

From Fields to Classroom: Sajida's Journey of Hope with TAKMIL

In a small village of Sanghar, Sindh, Sajida Solangi grew up carrying responsibilities far beyond her years. After losing her father eight years ago, she worked in the fields alongside her family to survive, while her dream of education quietly endured.

That dream became reality in 2024 when a Shaheed Umair Arshad TAKMIL school opened in her village. Enrolled in Class 5 for the first time, Sajida quickly found confidence, discipline, and joy in learning. Beyond reading and writing, she discovered a passion for art and design.

Today, Sajida's journey stands as a powerful reminder that when given opportunity, education can transform hardship into hope and reshape a child's future.

Mudasira Batool: A Future Teacher Rising from Gilgit-Baltistan

At just 8 years old, Mudasira Batool carries responsibilities far beyond her age. The eldest of three siblings in Akhon Colony, Gilgit-Baltistan, her early life was shaped by agricultural work alongside her parents and lessons at a local Madarsa. While she learned to recite the Qur'an, her curiosity for broader learning quietly grew.

In 2023, Mudasira's journey changed when she enrolled at Shaheed Mujtaba TAKMIL School. Stepping into a classroom for the first time, she embraced education with determination, balancing her studies with household responsibilities. Today, she is studying in Grade 5, supporting her younger brothers and excelling with confidence.

Mudasira dreams of becoming a teacher, committed to educating children in both Islamic and modern subjects.

Muhammad Bilal: From Child Labor to a Classroom Full of Hope

In the remote village of Kaccha Kakar, District Rajanpur, 10-year-old Muhammad Bilal spent his early years working in a welding shop—not by choice, but by necessity. With no school in his village, education was beyond reach. Alongside his nine siblings, Bilal helped his father in the fields, learning skills for survival rather than preparing for a future shaped by knowledge.

Everything changed in December 2024 when TAKMIL opened a school in Kaccha Kakar. For the first time, Bilal and his younger brother stepped into a classroom. Today, Bilal can confidently introduce himself in English and Urdu, excels in mathematics, and dreams of becoming a teacher to uplift his community.

Mehwish Falak: A Beacon of Resilience

Mehwish Falak is a 13-year-old girl from Model Town Manawala, Sheikhupura, whose childhood has been shaped by resilience and hope. With her father battling hepatitis and her mother working tirelessly in agriculture to support their family of four children, education once felt like a distant dream.

Before 2021, there was no school in Mehwish's village. She would watch other children walk long distances to study, an opportunity her family could not afford. Everything changed when TAKMIL School opened nearby. For the first time, Mehwish stepped into a classroom, discovering the joy of learning English, engaging in activity-based lessons, and exploring new ideas through educational videos.

Today, Mehwish is a determined learner with a powerful dream: to become a doctor and one day bring hope and care to families facing struggles like her own.

Ram Prakash – A Dream Beyond Boundaries

In the village of Qazi Rasool Baksh Raja, Sanghar, 12-year-old Ram Prakash grew up as the only brother among seven sisters in a family struggling to make ends meet. With limited resources, education once felt out of reach.

In 2022, everything changed when the Roshni TAKMIL School opened in his village. For the first time, Ram and five of his sisters stepped into a classroom—opening doors to a future they had never imagined.

Now in Grade 8, Ram excels in English and dreams of becoming an Army Officer, determined to serve his country with pride. Ram's story shows how one school can transform not just a child, but an entire family and community.



TAKMIL ANNUAL TRAININGS 2025

TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON ALP/NFE PROGRAM (PACKAGE D & E) JULY 2025

TAKMIL organized a comprehensive six-day training workshop on the ALP/NFE Program (Packages D & E) from 14th to 19th July 2025 at the Academic Block of Allama Iqbal Open University, Islamabad. The training aimed to build the capacity of field trainers to effectively implement the non-formal education curriculum across core subjects, including English, Mathematics, Urdu, Science, Social Studies, ICT, and Islamiyat.



Through interactive sessions, model lesson planning, and hands-on practice, the training empowered participants with content knowledge, modern teaching

methodologies, and digital integration techniques aligned with TAKMIL's inclusive education model. The workshop concluded with a celebratory ceremony, certificate distribution, and a commitment to quality education delivery in the field.

TAKMIL REGIONAL ELEMENTARY TEACHER TRAININGS PACKAGE D & E NOVEMBER 2025

In November 2025, TAKMIL successfully conducted its Regional Elementary Teacher Trainings (Package D & E) across multiple provinces of Pakistan, bringing together dedicated educators for days of intensive learning, collaboration, and professional growth.



The Regional Elementary Teacher Trainings (Package D & E) were conducted in two phases during November 2025. The first phase took place from November 3 to 8, 2025, at The Islamia University of Bahawalpur in Punjab and the University of Peshawar in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The second phase was held from November 10 to 14, 2025, across Sindh and Balochistan, extending the same training framework to educators in these regions to ensure consistent learning outcomes and nationwide impact.

STRATEGIC ENGAGEMENT WITH JAPAN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AGENCY (JICA)

TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON ALP/NFE PROGRAM (PACKAGE D & E)

On 14 May 2025, TAKMIL Foundation engaged in a strategic discussion with Mr. Abid Gill, Deputy Chief Advisor, Advancing Quality Alternative Learning (AQAL) Project – JICA. The session provided a valuable platform to reflect on TAKMIL's growth journey and explore opportunities to strengthen and scale alternative learning models across underserved regions of Pakistan.

The dialogue centered on shared priorities, system-level collaboration, and innovative approaches to addressing learning gaps among out-of-school children.

Mr. Gill's insights and guidance reinforced the importance of quality, inclusivity, and sustainability in expanding non-formal education pathways.



LAHORE SCIENCE MELA 2025



TAKMIL proudly participated in the Lahore Science Mela 2025, held on 25th and 26th October 2025 at Crescent Model School, Lahore. The event brought together students, educators, and innovators from across Pakistan, creating a vibrant space to celebrate scientific curiosity, creativity, and experiential learning.

This year's theme, Quantum Physics, encouraged participants to think critically about innovation and future-focused solutions. TAKMIL students actively engaged with this theme by presenting thoughtfully designed projects that reflected both scientific understanding and real-world application.

Students from Punjab, Sindh, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa represented their regions with confidence and enthusiasm, guided by the dedicated support of their teachers and school coordinators. In total, 10 students showcased three innovative projects, demonstrating strong teamwork, problem-solving skills, and a passion for learning.

The projects presented included an AI-based Smart Home model proven from Sindh, a Free Energy Water Wheel project from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and a Waste Management System developed by students from Punjab. Each project highlighted creativity, environmental awareness, and the effective application of scientific concepts.

TAKMIL's participation in the Lahore Science Mela 2025 reaffirmed our commitment to nurturing critical thinking, innovation, and confidence among students, especially those from underserved communities.



FAQS

Q: What is TAKMIL's mission?

TAKMIL is committed to providing free, quality education to out-of-school children in rural Pakistan with no access to schools.

Q: What age group does TAKMIL cater to?

TAKMIL focuses on children aged 5 to 16 years living in rural communities with no access to formal schools.

Q: What types of facilities are used for TAKMIL schools?

TAKMIL utilizes closed facilities such as the facilitator's home, mosque/madrassa, or community spaces like Baithak/Jirgah for school operations.

Q: Does TAKMIL provide infrastructure for school facilities?

No, TAKMIL does not provide infrastructure like school buildings, washrooms, cabinets etc.

Q: What support does TAKMIL provide to facilitators?

TAKMIL support facilitators and students with stationery, books, training, activity bags, a whiteboard, banners, school bags, floor mats, projectors, technology items, and part-time salaries.

Q: What is the role of a facilitator in a TAKMIL school?

Facilitators manage school operations, report on school progress, remove communication barriers, mobilize the community, and provide unbiased feedback.

Q: How are teachers compensated in the probation period?

During the probation period, teachers receive 50% of the total salary. Salaries are determined based on qualifications, with yearly increments based on performance.

Q: What is the probation period checklist for facilitators?

The checklist includes starting an advocacy campaign, enrolling students, conducting pre-assessments, submitting mark sheets, daily photos, responding to coordinator calls, submitting community council information, and daily implementation of lesson plans.

Q: What happens if the probation checklist is not fully completed?

If any item on the checklist is not completed, the school will not transition from probation to full onboarding.

Q: How does TAKMIL conduct the Advocacy Campaign?

Facilitators run a month-long door-to-door education awareness and enrollment campaign, recruiting children into TAKMIL schools and engaging the community in the education process.
